1 District Profile

1.1 Administrative Profile

Amravati city is administrative headquarters of Amravati district and Taluka. The district consists of six sub-divisions, which are further divided into 14 talukas. Amravati sub-division is divided into three talukas viz Amravati, Bhatukali and Nandgaon Khandeshwar. Daryapur sub-division is further divided into two talukas: Anjangaon and Daryapur. Achalpur sub-division also consists of two talukas: Achalpur and Chandur Bazar. Morshi sub-division has also two talukas: Morshi and Warud. Dharni sub-division is also divided into two talukas: Dharni and Chikhaldara. Finally, Chandur (Railway) sub-division is divided into three taluka's: Chandur (Railway), Tiosa and Dhamangaon.

1.2 Introduction

Amravati is a city in state of Maharashtra, India. It is the second largest city in Vidarbha region of Maharashtra after Nagpur and is administrative headquarter of the Amravati district. The district is primarily having agricultural sector as the main occupation. The city is a tourist hub surrounded by many historical monuments, including Amba Devi, temple of Shri Krishna, Sant Gadge Baba Samadhi, temple of Shri Venkateshwara Swamy also Hanuman Vyayam Prasarak Mandal, Melghat Tiger Reserve are among popular tourist destination. The city's quality of education attracts students from all over Vidarbha. The most spoken language in Amravati is Marathi.

1.3 Location and Geography

Amravati is located at 20.9320° N, 77.7523° E. It has an average elevation of 343 metres (1125 Feet). It Lies 156 km (97 Mi) west if Nagpur and Serves as administrative centre of Amravati District and of Amravati Division.

Amravati has a tropical climate. In winter, there is much less rainfall in Amravati than in summer. The climate here is classified as Aw by the Köppen-Geiger system. In Amravati, the average annual temperature is 26.7 °C | 80.0 °F. The annual rainfall is 1052 mm | 41.4 inch. Summers are dry and hot. The warmest month of the year is May, with an average temperature of 34.9 °C | 94.7 °F. January has the lowest average temperature of the year. It is 20.9 °C | 69.6 °F.

Rivers and tributaries in the district are as mentioned below.

- The Wardha River forms the eastern boundary of the district, and the eastern portion of the district lies within its watershed.
- The Purna River drains the southwestern portion of the district, while the northwest is drained by the Tapti River. The Purna rises near Bhainsdehi in Betul district of Madhya Pradesh in the Satpudas. After flowing for about 50km in a general southerly and southeasterly direction enters the district. It travels across the district in a south-westerly direction dividing it into two halves, first through the Achalpur taluka and then along the boundary between the Amravati and Daryapur talukas. Finally, it turns due westwards forming the boundary of the district and continues further to join the Tapti near Muktainagar in Jalgaon district.
- Other important rivers are Shahanoor and Chandrabhaga.

1.4 Demographic Profile

In the 2011 census Amravati district has a population of 28,88,445. This gives it a ranking of 131st in India (out of a total of 640). The district has a population density of 237 inhabitants per square kilometer (610/sq mi). Its population growth rate over the decade 2001-2011 was 10.77%. Amravati has a sex ratio of 947 females for every 1000 males, and a literacy rate of 88.23%.

1.5 Logistic Infrastructure Profile

- The nearby Port includes JNPT & ICD Nagpur / Borkhedi.
- Nagpur ICD is a dry port which is situated about 150 Kms from Amravati. It takes 2.5 hrs. to reach to the port.

The logistic infrastructure profile of the district is as mentioned below,

1.5.1 Road Transport

Amravati is connected by roads with various major cities of Maharashtra and other states. Road connectivity is excellent, and roads connecting to Mumbai, Pune, Nagpur, Satara, Kolhapur, Sangli, and Aurangabad are being upgraded to four-lane highways. National Highway 6 (old numbering), which runs from Hazira (Surat) to Kolkata, passes through Amravati.

Intercity Transport

The Maharashtra State Road Transport Corporation (MSRTC) provides transport services for intercity and interstate travel. Many private operators also ply on the highly travelled Amravati – Pune and Amravati – Indore route. Bus services to cities like Nagpur, Yavatmal, Bhopal, Harda, Indore, Raipur, Jabalpur, Mumbai, Pune, Akola, Dharni, Nanded, Aurangabad, Jalna, Burhanpur, Parbhani, Solapur, Khandwa, Gondia, Shirdi, Hyderabad, Paratwada (Achalpur) and Kolhapur are also available.

Intracity Transport

Amravati city bus service is run by the Amravati Municipal Corporation. Private auto rickshaws and cycle rickshaws are also popular. Amravati has also started a Women's Special City bus which is a first in the Vidarbha region.

1.5.2 Rail Transport

Amravati has three railway stations:

- Amravati railway station situated in the heart of the city is a terminus. The railway line could not be extended beyond it. Therefore, a new station was constructed outside the city when a new railway line was laid to connect Badnera junction to Narkhed on the Nagpur-Itarsi main railway line. Amravati railway station is situated on the branch line from Badnera on Nagpur-Bhusawal section of Howrah-Nagpur-Mumba line of Central Railways.
- New Amravati railway station building was inaugurated on 10 December 2011. Amravati railway station provides multiple shuttle services to Badnera throughout the day.
- Badnera Junction railway station serves the area of Badnera in Amravati. It is a junction station on the Howrah-Nagpur-Mumbai line. There is a broad gauge line to Narkhed.

1.5.3 Air Transport

Amravati Airport, located at Bellora, 15 kilometers from NH-6 towards Yavatmal, is operated by the Maharashtra Airport Development Company (MADC). Presently it has no commercial scheduled flights. The Nagpur Flying Club has applied to DGCA for permission to shift its flying operations to Amravati airport. It also has a helipad facility. MADC is acquiring about 400 Hectares of land for developing the airport and related facilities at an estimated cost of Rs. 2.25 billion.

1.6 Agricultural Profile

Amravati is the main growing region for Cotton. It is growing as an Industrial center, with cotton Mills leading the way.

Tur is also produced in Amravati in large numbers. Another major crop which is grown in bulk in Amravati district is Soyabean. Amravati is the highest producer of soyabean in Maharashtra when it comes to area under cultivation. For the present 120 Soyabean Growing cultivator

from Amravati district were selected data related to marketing were collected from APMC (Agriculture Produce Market Committee) Amravati which is one of the most important marketing channels was identified in Amravati market i.e Producer – Wholesaler – Retailer – Consumer. Farmers always desire to get reasonable price for their farm product.

Another major crop which is produce in Amravati district is Orange which is the one of the important fruit crops in Amravati district. In Amravati near about 80,000-hectare area is under orange cultivation and out of that near about 70,000 hectares is productive orchard. Oranges have a huge demand in the export market all over the world. Oranges have also been identified as ODOP product for Amravati District.


