1 District Profile

1.1 Introduction

The geographical area of Gadchiroli is divided into 6 revenue subdivisions viz. Gadchiroli, Wadsa, Ettapalli, Chamorshi, Kurkheda and Aheri. Gadchiroli is predominantly district of agriculturists. Out of the total rural population of 9.60 lakh in the district, around 1.49 lakh are having agriculture as the main activity.

1.2 Administrative Profile

For the purpose of administrative conveyance, the district is divided into 12 Tahsils and 12 Panchayat Samities. According to the 2001 Census, there was 467 Gram Panchayat for the purpose of Rural Development. The main crop grown in the district is paddy. Gadchiroli district stretches over an area of 14412 sq. km. In terms of area, Gadchiroli district constitutes 4.68% of the total area of the Maharashtra State. Around 76% of the geographical area of the district is covered under forest.

1.3 Location and Geography

Gadchiroli district lies between 19-to-21-degree North Latitude and 80 to 81 degree East Longitudes. The Waiganga is the major river of the district. Bhandara district is situated in Wainganga basin. It has a common boarder on North with Bhandara and Gondia Chandrapur district districts. on the west. Rajnandgaon and bastar districts of Madhya Pradesh to the East and Karimnagar and Adilabad districts of Andhra Pradesh to the south. The district is covered by clay, sandy loam, deep black, reddish and yellow soils with portions of black soil and has an annual average rainfall of 1315 mm.



1.4 Demographic Profile

The population of the district as per 2011 Census was 10.79 lakh, of which the share of rural and urban

population was at 89% and 11% respectively. The district is largely known by tribe community. Nearly 38% of the population of ST is found in the district

1.5 Climatic Conditions

Located near centre of Indian peninsula, far from the Bay of Bengal and Arabian Sea, Gadchiroli has a tropical wet and dry climate with dry conditions prevailing for most of the year.

1.6 Logistic Infrastructure Profile

The nearest airport is situated in the city of Nagpur. Only, 18.5 kms railway route passes in the district. Chandrapur and Gadchiroli is approximately 210 km. Train services link Chandrapur with various parts of Maharashtra like Pune, Kolhapur, Mumbai and so on. The Delhi-Chennai rail route runs through Chandrapur district. Nearby Ports including JNPT, Mumbai and ICD Nagpur and Borkhedi.

1.7 Agricultural Profile

Rice is the primary crop of the district. Gadchiroli district is well-known for the forest resources. Out of the total geographical area, 76% (1133 thousand hectare) is under forest. Silk is also largely produced in the district. Most of the area (85.76%) of district is occupied by the forest and therefore cultivable land is very less. The climate of the district is also suitable for horticulture and plantation crops like Mango, Guava and Amla, etc.

1.12 Banking Facilities

The district is lagging behind in the good banking network with 47 branches of Commercial Banks, 19 branches of Vidarbha-Konkan Gramin Bank, 55 branches of Gadchiroli DCCB, Postal bank and 254 Primary Agriculture Credit Societies and Large Adivasi Multi-Purpose Societies (PACS/LAMPS). However, concentration of branches is in semi-urban areas and rural areas. More than 70% part of the district remains poorly covered in terms of branch network.


