#### 1 District Profile

#### 1.1 Introduction

The Hingoli district came into existence by division of Parbhani district on 1st May 1999. The district is an administrative district in the state of Maharashtra in India. The district is situated at the northern part of Marathwada in Maharashtra. The borders of Hingoli are surrounded by Akola and Yeotmal in northern side, Parbhani in western side and Nanded at south-eastern side.

The Hingoli will make its presence felt in the cutting edge of experimental Physics. It has been selected for the LIGO-India. LIGO-India is a planned advanced gravitational-wave observatory to be located in India as part of the worldwide network. The project recently received inprinciple approval from the Indian government. LIGO-India is planned as a collaborative project between a consortium of Indian research institutions and the LIGO Laboratory in the United States, along with its international partners Australia, Germany and the UK. It is also named as IndIGO.

The twelve jyotirlingas are the most significant places of pilgrimage for Hindus in India, five of them happen to be in Maharashtra. The Aundha-Nagnath is one of them and is in Hingoli District.

#### 1.2 Administrative Profile

The Hingoli district headquarter is located at city of Hingoli. Administratively, the district is grouped into two subdivisions which are divided into five talukas: Hingoli, Basmat, Kalamanuri, Aundha Nagnath and Sengaon.

### 1.3 Location and Geography

The Hingoli district situated at the northern part of Marathwada in Maharashtra and located at 19.05 to 20.05 North Latitude and 76.30 to 77.30 East longitudes. The district covers an area of 4526 sq. km.

The Hingoli district falls in the center part of state and lies in Godavari basin and falls under the Painganaga basin with Kayadhu-Purna sub-basin. The Malhiwara hill ranges separate the Kayadhu and Purna river basins. Kayadhu and Purna river drained through some part of district. The Painganga river makes a boundary within Hingoli-Washim & Yavatmal District which also denotes the boundary between Marathwada & Vidarbha Region. The entire District falls in Middle Godavari river basin.

The climate of the district is characterized by a hot summer and a general dryness throughout the year except during the southwest monsoon season, which is from June to September while October and November constitute the post monsoon season. The normal annual rainfall over the district varies from 500 mm to 800 mm.

Major three rivers flowing through the district,

- Kayadhu River is the main river of the district. It flows through Sengaon, Hingoli, Aundha and Kalamnuri talukas and meets to Painganga River in Nanded district.
- Painganga River flows in northern region of the district and passes through Sengaon and Kalamnuri talukas.
- Purna River flows from southern side of Sengaon and flows further south from Aundha and Basmat.

#### 1.4 Demographic Profile

According to the 2011 census Hingoli district has a population of 1,177,345 of which male and female were 6,06,294 and 5,71,051 respectively. This gives it a ranking of 401<sup>st</sup> in India (out of a total of 640). In 2001 census, Hingoli had a population of 9,87,160 of which males were

5,05,373 and remaining 4,81,787 were females. Its population growth rate over the decade 2001-2011 was 19.43%. The district has a population density of 244 inhabitants per sq. km. Its population growth rate over the decade 2001-2011 was 19.43%. It has a sex ratio of 942 females for every 1000 males, and a literacy rate of 78.17%.

#### 1.5 Logistic Infrastructure Profile

- JNPT (575 km., 11.50 hrs.) and Dighi (625 km., 13.51 hrs.) are the nearest seaport and dry port available for district.
- ▶ Jalna dry port (164 km., 03.00 hrs.) which is in catchment area of JNPT, work is in progress and will improve cargo movement to the port. The main objective of this project is to deliver agricultural and industrial products from Marathwada directly to Nhava Sheva Port Trust in Mumbai. The Mumbai-Nagpur Samruddhi Highway work is in progress which is passing near to this dry port. Through this, the products will be delivered directly to Mumbai.

### 1.5.1 Road Transport

The district of Hingoli is well served by a network of roads. Intra-city road transportation is good in Hingoli. There is a National Highway (NH-161) connecting Akola- Hyderabad passing through the district.

#### 1.5.2 Rail Transport

The Hingoli railway station in Hingoli city lies on Purna–Khandwa section of South-Central Railway. It is well connected to cities like Hyderabad, Mumbai, Jaipur, Kota, Ajmer, Indore, New Delhi, Bhopal, Agra, Tirupati, Chandigarh, Amritsar and Sri Ganganagar.

The major railway stations near to Hingoli are Nanded railway station (84 km.), Parbhani railway station (75 km.) & Akola railway station (135 km.) which are connected to all major cities.

The service is available for below mentioned destinations.

### 1.5.3 Air Transport

The nearest airport for the district is Shri Guru Gobind Singh Ji Airport at Nanded. The Airport is having the airport facilities including aircraft refueling, night Landing with navigational aids, aircraft Parking, CAT VI airport Fire Fighting & Rescue Service. A well-equipped terminal building with VIP Lounges, Departure and Arrival Lounges, Transit Suites & Snooze Cabins, Visitors Waiting Area, Cafeteria. It is served by daily flights to Hyderabad and Mumbai and on Saturday and Sunday, connecting flight to Amritsar. Due to current situation, this airport is not fully operationalized.

The other nearest fully operational airport for the district is Chikalthana, Aurangabad Airport (IXU). The flights are available to Hyderabad, Delhi, Udaipur, Mumbai, Chennai, Bangalore, Ahmadabad, Jaipur and Nagpur. The international airlines have been available for Hajj since 2008. The airport facilities include aircraft fuelling, night landing with navigational aids, aircraft parking, CAT VII airport firefighting and rescue service. A well-equipped terminal building has VIP lounges, departure and arrival lounges, transit suites and snooze cabins, visitors' waiting area, and a cafeteria.

#### 1.6 Agricultural Profile

The Hingoli district is predominantly an agricultural district and Jawar, Turmeric, Bajari (Millet), Maka (Maize), and Pulses like Tur, Bhuimug, Til, Sunflower and cash crops like Cotton are produced in district. The Jawar is main crop in both kharif and rabbi seasons and Basmat taluka leads in its production.

The Cotton is another important cash crop in the district. The Sugarcane is gaining popularity in the district as more and more land is being brought under its cultivation. Kalamnuri and Basmat talukas being irrigated, sugarcane is grown in these talukas on a large scale. In addition, Horticulture fruits like Banana, Orange (Santra), Sweet Orange (Mosambi), Mango, Papaya, Anola and Horticulture crops-vegetables like Tomato, Brinjal, Okra (Bhendi), Chilli are also grown.

The Siddheshwar dam is used for irrigation purpose in the district. There are another two medium-sized dams on both East and West sides of the district; Isapur and Yeldari dam. The Isapur dam provides water to irrigation purpose whereas Yeldari dam caters to irrigation as well as production of hydroelectricity.

The Hingoli district is industrially backward district of Maharashtra and scheduled as "No Industry District" under Industrial policy due to low industrial growth in district. The contribution of industry in development of district is disappointingly small.

The Hingoli MIDC has developed the Hingoli Industrial Area, with the objective to attract industrialists and local entrepreneurs to set up industries and invest in the region and the industrial development will also attract foreign direct investments in the region. The MIDC has

provided the best possible infrastructure to facilitate industrial development and every assistance is provided for their growth. The Hingoli industrial area is situated on the Hingoli-Aundha-Parbhani State Highway which connects to all the major road networks of the state and is very close to the Hingoli city. The nearest railway station is at Hingoli which is about 8 km. from the industrial area.


