1 District Profile

1.1 Introduction

Jalgaon District is in the north-west region of the state of Maharashtra. It is bounded by Satpuda mountain ranges in the north, Ajanta Mountain ranges in the south. Jalgaon is rich in volcanic soil which is well suited for cotton production. Marathi is the local language. People speak Hindi in the areas bordering Madhya Pradesh. The staple food of the people is millets, wheat, and rice.

Four main fairs are held in the district which attract several devotees not only from within the district but also from the rest of the state. These are: the Shri Rama Rathotsava fair at Jalgaon town, held during the Hindu month of Kartik; the Navaratri-Mahalaxmi fair at Jalgaon town during Navaratri, Changdeo fair at the Changdeo temple located about 6 kms northwest of Muktainagar, and the Mukatabai fair held again in Magha at Kothali, in Muktainagar tehsil.

1.2 Climatic Conditions

In Jalgaon, the wet season is oppressive and mostly cloudy, the dry season is mostly clear, and it is hot year-round. Over the course of the year, the temperature typically varies from 58°F to 108°F and is rarely below 52°F or above 112°F.

Jalgaon on an average receives between 77 cm and 80 cm of rainfall per year. In the eastern most part of the district—i.e., in Yawal—the average annual rainfall is 77 cm. In Bhusawal, Pachora, and the city of Jalgaon, it is 79 cm; and in Jamner, it is 80 cm.

1.3 Administrative Profile

Jalgaon district is divided into Six subdivisions namely (Jalgaon, Bhusawal, Pachora, Amalner, Faizpur, Chalisgaon, for revenue and administrative convenience. This district is divided into fifteen Tahasil's and fifteen Panchayat Samitie's for administrative purpose. As per 2011 census there are 1501 villages & 1152 Gram Panchayat.

1.4 Location and Geography

Geographical location: Between 20° and 21° North latitudes and 74° 55′ to 76° 28′ East longitudes, in the northern part of the state. Jalgaon City located at Longitude 75.5626039 and Latitude 21.0076578. Adjoining districts to Jalgaon are, in North: Satpuda Hills, South: Aurangabad and Nashik, East: Madhya Pradesh and Buldhana, West: Dhule.

1.5 Demographic Profile

According to 2011, Jalgaon had population of 4,229,917 of which male and female were 2,197,365 and 2,032,552 respectively. In 2001 census, Jalgaon had a population of 3,682,690 of which males were 1,905,493 and remaining 1,777,197 were females. Jalgaon District population constituted 3.76 percent of total Maharashtra population. In 2001 census, this figure for Jalgaon District was at 3.80 percent of Maharashtra population.

There was change of 14.86 percent in the population compared to population as per 2001. In the previous census of India 2001, Jalgaon District recorded increase of 15.53 percent to its population compared to 1991.

1.6 Logistic Infrastructure Profile

There is a good surface communication between Jalgaon to taluka places. There in normal communication between Block to Villages. 97% villages are linked with roads. 38% villages are seasonally linked by roads.

1.6.1 Road Transport

National Highway 6 (Surat-Nagpur-Kolkata) passes through the city. Important cities of the state are also connected by state highways. Accessibility to the major port is achieved through this national highway.

1.6.2 Rail Transport

The city is served by Jalgaon Junction railway station. The railway connects the city to major cities like New Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Hyderabad, Jaipur and many more.

1.6.3 Air Transport

Jalgaon airport was built in 1973 by the Public Works Department. The Jalgaon Municipal council took over its operations in April 1997 and handed it over to the Maharashtra Airport Development Company in April 2007. The Government of Maharashtra signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with The Airports Authority of India (AAI) to upgrade the existing airfield in July 2009. The then President of India, Pratibha Patil laid the foundation stone for the development and expansion of the Jalgaon airport in June 2010. Jalgaon has two flights one for Mumbai and one for Ahmedabad operated by Trujet airlines.

1.7 Agricultural Profile

As per the land utilization pattern of the district, Jalgaon district has 8.92 lakh ha. Land available for cultivation out of which 7.98 lakh ha. Land is cultivable under different crops. As per available data the surface & well irrigation is up to 2.94 lakh ha. i.e., 17.80% of total cropped area.

Major crops in Jalgaon are Banana, Wheat, millet, lime, groundnut, cotton, sugarcane. The district is divided into two agro climatic zones, on is Scarcity zone consisting of 5 block & another one is Assured rainfall zone consisting of 10 blocks. In these zones the cropping pattern is different.

Today Jalgaon district is known as Cotton & Banana bowl of the State, as 4 lakh ha area is under cotton & 48000 ha. Area is under Banana crop. These two crops are main cash crops generating major labor potential. These crops affect the economy of the district. Maze is emerging as another important crop in the district.

In horticulture Banana and Pomegranate being the most valued crop farmers are following it Custard apple and lemon and another important crops of district Brinjal vegetable crops of district. Due to increase in irrigated areas rabbi area is increasing. In recent years there in increase in area of cotton, Maize, Soyabean crops and reduction in the crop area of Cereals, Deshi cotton, Sunflower & Sesamum. There is increase in Wheat & Gram crops due to availability of irrigation.


