Sindhudurg District Profile

Introduction

Sindhudurg was carved out of the undivided Ratnagiri district in 1981 and is home to about 8.5 lakh population (Census 2011), 87 percent of whom live in rural areas. Spread over 5207 sq. km, it has a 121 km Arabian Sea coast to the west, the Sahyadri hills of the Western Ghats ecosystem passing through, with the Sindhudurg plateau in between

Administrative Profile

The district is divided into three sub-divisions, viz. Kankavali, Kudal, and Sawantwadi. There are 8 tehsils along with 431 Gram Panchayats in 752 Villages. The district has 03 Nagar Parishads & 05 Nagar Panchayats. The district headquarters are located at Sindhudurg Nagari, with the central Government offices in Oros..

The collector is the Administrative Chief and the Tehsil level at the district level. For rural development, the Chief Executive Officer of Zilla Parishad at the district level and the Block Development Officer at the Block level oversee the administration. Municipal Councils are responsible for urban development work.

The district collector is also responsible for leading District Export Promotion Council.

Demographic Profile

Sindhudurg is one of the districts of Maharashtra in India, Sindhudurg District population in 2021 is 909,167 (estimates as per Aadharuidai.gov.in Dec 2020 data). As per the 2011 census of India, Sindhudurg District had a population of 849,651, out of which 417,332 are male, and 432,319 are female. Literate people are 666,067 out of 348,289 are male, and 317,778 are female. People living in Sindhudurg District depend on multiple skills; total workers are 347,178, of which men are 229,676 and women are 117,502. Total 82,966 Cultivators are dependent on agriculture farming; out of 55,940 are cultivated by men, and 27,026 are women. 36,543 people work in agricultural land as labour; men are 24,653, and 11,890 are women.

Sindhudurg District sex ratio is 1,036 females per 1000 males.
