Solapur District Profile

Introduction

Solapur is one of the most important cities in Western Maharashtra. Solapur, in Maharashtra, is situated at ~400 km from Mumbai, which is the nearest port. The textile industry is one of the oldest and the most widespread in Solapur. The district is home to the Handloom and Powerloom weaving industry, employing many workers and around 6000 power loom industries operational in the district.

Administrative Profile

Solapur district is subdivided for administrative purposes into eleven talukas, which comprise smaller divisions. The talukas are North Solapur, South Solapur, Akkalkot, Barshi, Mangalwedha, Pandharpur, Sangola, Malshiras, Mohol, Madha, and Karmala.

Location and Geography

Geographically Solapur is located between 17.10 to 18.32 degrees north latitude and 74.42 to 76.15 degrees east longitude. The district is situated on the southeast fringe of Maharashtra State and lies entirely in the Bhima and Sina basins. The district is bounded on the north by Ahmednagar and Osmanabad districts, on the east by Osmanabad and Gulbarga (Karnataka State) districts, on the south by Sangli and Bijapur (Karnataka State), and on the west by Satara and Pune districts.

Only in the north of Barshi Taluka, several spurs of the Balaghat range pass south for a few kilometers. There are also a few scattered hills in Karmala, Madha, and Malshiras Talukas. The district, in general, has flat or undulating terrain. The low table land and small separate hills in Karmala and Madha Talukas are watersheds between Bhima and Sina rivers. The district covers a geographical area of 14844.6 sq. km, which is 4.82% of the total area of Maharashtra State. Out of the district's total area, 338.8 sq. km (2.28%) is an Urban area, whereas the remaining 14505.8 sq. km. (97.72%) is Rural area. Area wise Karmala taluka is the biggest covering an area of 1609.7 sq. km, and North Solapur is the smallest, surrounding an area of 736.3 sq. km.

Demographic Profile

In 2011, Solapur had population of 4,315,527 of which male and female were 2,233,778 and 2,081,749 respectively. Solapur District's population constituted 3.84 percent of the total Maharashtra population. In the 2001 census, this figure for Solapur District was at 3.97 percent of Maharashtra's population. The population's growth rate is 12.10 percent compared to the population as of 2001.

Logistic Infrastructure Profile

JNPT and Dighi are the nearest seaports and dry ports for the Solapur district.

The logistic infrastructure profile of the district is as mentioned below,

The Solapur district is well connected by all the means of transport viz Airways, Trains and Roadways. Mostly the Rail track and Roadways are used for transportation.

Road Transport

Solapur district is well connected with major cities as NH-9, NH-13, NH-211, and NH-204 passes through Solapur. It is also a well-known and convenient trading center for neighboring States, as it is located on Pune-Hyderabad NH and Solapur-Bijapur NH.

Rail Transport

The Solapur division is a vital division connecting South India to western and northwest India. Sangli is considered the gateway to the south in terms of its location on the rail network. The total rail track is about 380 km in the district and has two Railway Junctions, i.e., Kurduwadi and Hotgi.

Air Transport

Solapur Airport is in the south of Solapur city, and currently, it has no scheduled services.

Agricultural Profile

The district is spread over 1501 thousand hectares with 11 talukas. Solapur occupies 4.83% area and has a 4.10 % share of the population of Maharashtra State. The district topography is divided into three natural zones as below:

Eastern zone: (Barshi, North Solapur, South Solapur, and Akkalkot Talukas):

- Soil: The soil is medium to deep black and of rich quality.
- Crop: Bajra and Pulses are the main crops of this zone

Central Zone: (Mohol, Mangalwedha, eastern part of Pandharpur and Madha Taluka):

- Soil: not available
- Crop: Both Kharif & Rabbi crops are grown in this part

Western Zone: (Karmala, Sangola and Malshiras Talukas and western parts of Pandharpur):

- Soil: Shallow and poor soil type, not retentive of moisture marks this part. Scanty and uncertain rainfall.
- Crop: Rabbi crops are grown in Karmala, Pandharpur, and Madha Talukas, while Kharip crops like Jowar & Groundnut are grown in Sangola and Malshiras.

Industrial Profile

Industrial Areas in Solapur District are as mentioned below,

- Solapur is one of the most important cities in Western Maharashtra. Solapur, in Maharashtra, is situated at ~400 km from Mumbai, which is the nearest port. The textile industry is one of the oldest and the most widespread in Solapur. Solapur is now home to the Handloom and Powerloom weaving industry, which employs many workers. There are around 6000 power loom industries operational in the district.
- The textile industries in Solapur produce cotton yarn, and process yarn for doubling, dyeing, warping, and weaving by power looms. These industries are located at MIDC, Gandhi Nagar, Bhavani Peth, Bhadravathi Peth, and New Paccha Peth. The majority of the industries have been in operation for 20 to 30 years. The primary raw material (cotton yarn) is procured from local manufacturers/traders.
