
Maharashtra is one of the major contributors to textile and apparel production in India



- Cotton 80.35 lakhs bales FY 2023-23

Industrial Promotion Subsidy

- LSI- 50% Gross SGST payable
- Special LSI- Except for zone A & B 40% net SGST payable

Stamp Duty Exemption

- Zones A & B 75% exemption in private IT/BT parks & for others 50%
- 100% exemption for other zones (except zones A & B)

Electricity Duty Exemption

- Zone A & B 100% exemption for manufacturing units for 7 years
- 100% exemption for other zones

For expansion or diversifications Units

 Expansion or diversification units qualify for incentives equivalent to 80% of those available to new units

Ultra Mega & Mega Projects

- Tailor made incentives: HPC to recommend customized Package of Incentives on caseto-case basis
- Projects of Special Importance may get customized package of incentives on case-to-case basis via HPC

- Fiscal and infrastructural support for setting up of 6 technical textile parks
- Fund for the promotion of research and development
- Launching of Maharashtra Technical Textile
 Mission on the lines of National Technical
 Textile Mission



Social Inclusion and women empowerment

- Additional fiscal incentives to promote job opportunities SC/ ST/ Minorities
- Additional capital subsidy for women-run units and technical textile parks
- Setting up of Mother and child units to promote local employment

Environment ad Sustainability

- · Capital subsidy for setting up Recycling plants
- Capital subsidy for setting up Effluent Treatment Plants (ETP), Zero Liquid Discharge (ZLD) and Steam Generation Plant
- Fiscal incentives for installation of solar plants

Increase the Processing capacity of raw material

- Increase cotton processing from 30-80% in the next 5 years
- · Establishment grainage center for sericulture

Skill Development and Capacity Building

- Training program under Skill Development Program through Weaver Seva Kendra or Technical Training Institute
- MoUs to be signed with prominent institutes and associations such as IIT Bombay, VJTI, SASMIRA, BTRA etc
- Fiscal support for the establishment of new training centers

Policy focus area | Technical Textiles





Eligibility Criteria

To qualify as a park the criteria will be to have minimum 10 technical textile units.

None of the units should have more than 25% of the total required park area as per Detailed Project Report

Minimum fixed capital investment (FCI) of INR 400 cr to qualify as a technical textile park.

Must have an established skill development centre with minimum capacity of 30 individuals to ensure continuous training

Infrastructure Support


Land and supporting infrastructure to be made available in MIDC area in 6 revenue divisions of the State.

Capital Subsidy

- Capital subsidy @ 55% or INR 250 cr on Investment between INR 400 cr to INR 1000 cr.
- Investment more than INR 1000 cr will be treated as Ultra Mega projects and will be given Special Package of Incentives

Support for Effluent Treatment Plants

50% capital subsidy or INR 5 cr whichever is less



Support for Zero Liquid Discharge

50% of civil infra/ plant & machinery cost up to a maximum of INR 10 cr for setting up of common ZLD plant

Support for Solar Plants

Units will include the cost of installation of solar power plant in the Detailed Project Report and the capital subsidy will be calculated on the Fixed capital investment including the cost of solar plant up to maximum of 4MW

Support for Research & Development

INR 50 cr will be added every year to promote research and development in technical textile sector.



Qualification Criteria



Policy Highlights

- 100% Captive Process Vendor (CPV) investment to be considered as part of admissible FCI
- CPV and Captive Power Plant won't be counted for determining qualifying criteria
- HPC to recommend customized Package of Incentives on case-to-case basis
- Projects of Special Importance (may or may not be Mega/Ultra-Mega projects) may get customized package of incentives on case-to-case basis via HPC
- State government will be equity partner of 9% through MVRPL in projects with FCI of more than 500 cr
- Allocation of MIDC land on priority basis

- In New MIDC industrial estates, 20% area to be reserved for MSMEs; Up to 100% stamp duty exemption.
- Electricity duty exemption for Eligibility period; IPS on Gross SGST paid by the units.
- Power tariff subsidy (except A zone) to an extent of INR 1 per unit for 3 years.
- MSMEs in Food Processing, Green Energy and Industry 4.0, will get additional fiscal support
- Interest subsidy @ 5 % p.a. (except A zone), maximum upto electricity bills paid for the year; Marketing Assistance scheme Go Back

Integrated and Sustainable Textile Policy 2023-2028 (2/2)





Promoting Green & Sustainable Production



50% capital subsidy or INR 5 cr whichever is less for establishment of Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP)/ Common Effluent Treatment Plant (CETP).



50% capital subsidy or INR 1 cr, whichever is less will be provided for setting up of **common steam generation plant.**



50% of eligible civil infrastructure/ plant& machinery cost upto a maximum of INR10 cr for setting up of ZLD plants.



Subsidy @ 50% or INR 2 cr, whichever is less, for new projects setup exclusively for recycling of old textile products.



Cost of Installation of solar power plant (upto 4 MW capacity) to be included in eligible FCI for capital subsidy



Capital subsidy equivalent to the subsidy provided for 12 months' worth of electricity subsidy will be given to the solar energy projects. (for existing textile units)
